A coach and a driver will ensure a comfortable journey along the French country roads and enable us to drive to different destinations every day and admire spectacular scenery.

Attention Walkers

The walking tours are suitable for regular, experienced walkers. The itineraries will vary and include mountain trails, country lanes and forest trails. The grades of the walks will range from easy to challenging, depending on your choice of itinerary. The distance of the walks will vary from 5kms to 18kms and the ascents from 100m to 700m. Both up and downhill training are important especially for the mountain itineraries.

We suggest that, for your greatest enjoyment and appreciation of the walking tours, you try to arrive in Europe a few days prior to the tour starting, so you will be rested beforehand.

May 2025 Itinerary Dordogne / Perrigor region

Discover one of France's most scenic regions with its ancient traditions and its abundance of produce set in a landscape of winding rivers and mystical forests. Staying in a Chateau in the Bastide town of Monpazier voted as one of France's most beautiful villages. This tour combines easier walking in undulating country with a gourmet experience of the region's delicacies! Easy grade walks with distances between 7 and 14kms.

Walking tour: May 8th – May 16th Cost: \$ 5280 per person twin share Single supplement: \$800

Thursday 8th May:

Participants will be met at Bergerac railway station at 15.00. This is the arrival time of the TER from Bordeaux which connects with the TGV departing Paris Montparnasse. **Timetable will be confirmed a few months before the start of the tour.** [Train tickets not included in package]. Participants will be met and taken to the hotel in Monpazier, approximately 40 minutes away. Those who are not using this pick-up service will make their own way to the hotel. We will meet for welcome drinks followed by dinner at the hotel.

Friday 9th May:

Bus trip to St Cyprien for a 4km walk to a truffle farm including a visit and lunch in a nearby restaurant. Free time in the afternoon in the village of Limeuil, voted one of France's most beautiful villages. Light dinner in a nearby restaurant.

Saturday 10^h May:

We will start the 14km walk in Monpazier and walk to Lacapelle Biron. Picnic lunch. Dinner at the hotel. Sunday 11^h May:

Bus trip to Issigned for free time at the fabulous market, followed by a light lunch in Monflanquin. After lunch we will visit hazelnut and prune farms. This region is prized all over France for its hazelnuts and prunes! Dinner at the hotel.

Monday 12th May:

Bus trip to Pomport for a 12km walk among the Bergerac & Monbazillac vineyards followed by a wine tasting. Picnic lunch. Dinner at the hotel.

Tuesday 13th May:

Bus trip to Beynac for a 7km walk to La Roque Gageac along the Dordogne River. In the afternoon we will visit Chateau Milandes and its gardens and learn the amazing story of Josephine Baker. Picnic lunch. Dinner at the hotel.

Wednesday 14th May:

Bus trip to Berbiguières for a 7km walk to a ferme auberge for lunch. Light dinner at a bar/deli. **Thursday 15th May:**

Bus trip to Pechboutier for a cooking demonstration which includes a light lunch. After lunch we will drive to Trémolat for a 7km walk with a panoramic view of the Dordogne River. Farewell dinner at the hotel. **Friday 16th May:**

The bus will take all participants to Bergerac railway station in the morning to catch the TER at 10.06 to connect in Bordeaux with the TGV for Paris, Gare Montparnasse. This will be the only transport organised that day. **Details will be confirmed a few months before the start of the tour.**

2025 Itinerary in the Midi Pyrénées Region

The Hautes Pyrenees region (Tour de France country), has spectacular views, a national park abundant with rare fauna & flora and mountain villages overflowing with character, charm and history. The beautiful village of Arreau will be our base for the tour.

Walking tour: Sept 4th – Sept 12th

Cost: \$ 4870 per person twin share

Single supplement: \$ 550

Thursday 4th September:

Participants will be met in Lannemezan railway station at 16.00. This is the arrival time of the TER from Tarbes which connects with the TGV departing Paris Montparnasse at 09.45. **Timetable to be confirmed a few months before the start of the tour.** [Train tickets not included in package]. Participants will be taken to the hotel in Arreau, approximately 30 minutes away. Those who are not using this pick-up service will make their own way to the hotel. We will meet for welcome drinks followed by dinner at the hotel.

Friday 5th September:

Bus trip to Gouaux for a 5 hour walk village to village, including a visit to a goat farm, and finish in Arreau. Picnic lunch. Dinner at the hotel.



Saturday 6th September:

Bus trip to the Col D'Azet for a 4 hour walk starting between the Aure and Louron valleys following the trail down to St Lary. Light lunch at a local Auberge. Dinner at the hotel.

Sunday 7th September:

Start in Arreau for a 14km walk on the Santiago De Compostella trail to Héchettes. Picnic lunch. Dinner at the hotel.

Monday 8th September:

Bus trip to Esparros to visit one of Europe's most amazing abysses, followed by a visit to a working water mill still producing flour. Lunch will include a taste of the south, followed by a game of pétanque. Dinner in a nearby restaurant.

Tuesday 9th September:

Bus trip to the natural reserve of Néouvielle for a 4.5 hour walk around the lakes. Picnic lunch. Dinner at the hotel.

Wednesday 10th September:

Bus trip to Spain for a 5 hour walk in the Pineta Valley. Picnic lunch. Dinner at the hotel. **Thursday 11th September:**

Free time in the morning during market day before making our way to Loudenvielle for a walk around the village and lake followed by lunch. Dinner in a nearby restaurant.

Friday 12th September:

The bus will take all participants to Lannemezan railway station in the morning to catch the TER to Tarbes at 09.56 to connect with the TGV for Paris, Montparnasse. This will be the only transport organised that day. **Details will be confirmed a few months before the start of the tour.**

The Basque country is one of France's most colourful regions offering a long list of unforgettable culture, history, charm and of course – food!!!! A place to remember! We will be staying in the beautiful village of Espelette.

Walking tour: Sept 21st - Sept 29thCost: \$ 4710 per person twin shareSingle supplement: \$ 495

Sunday 21st September:

All participants will be met at Bayonne railway station at 14.00. This is the arrival time of the TGV from Paris, Montparnasse. Details will be confirmed a few months before the start of the tour. [Train tickets not included in package]. Participants will be met and taken to the hotel in Espelette, approximately 30 minutes away. Those who are not using this pick-up service will make their own way to the hotel. The afternoon will be free to relax and explore the village. Welcome drinks followed by dinner in the hotel.

Monday 22nd September:

Bus trip to St Jean Pied de Port to spend time at the local market and then on to the village of Irouléguy where we will start our 8km country lane walk to the village of St Étienne de Baigorry. Picnic lunch. After lunch we will stroll around the village and later visit a chilli farm. Dinner in a nearby restaurant.

Tuesday 23rd September:

Bus trip to Les Aldudes for a 4 hour walk among the palombieres [the wild squab hunting huts] with magical valley views. Picnic lunch. After the walk we will visit a Basque Charcuterie, enjoy a tasting, and see the unique breed of Basque pig. Dinner in a nearby restaurant.

Wednesday 24th September:

We will cross the border into Spain and walk along the ridge of Mount Jaizkebel to the seaport of Passajes taking in the spectacular views of the Pyrénées and the Atlantic. Light lunch in a restaurant and free time to visit the village. Dinner at the hotel.

Thursday 25th September:

The morning will start with a guided tour of Espelette with a local personality, followed by a visit to the chocolate maker and then a tasting of the locally produced foie gras. We will then make our way to the port of Socoa, for Ttoro, a traditional Basque seafood soup, followed by a stroll along the water's edge and free time to experience the history and charm of St Jean de Luz. Dinner at the hotel.

Friday 26th September:

Bus trip to Urdax in Spain for a 4 hour walk crossing back into France. Picnic lunch. Dinner at the hotel. Saturday 27th September:

4 hour walk in the hills surrounding the village of Itxassou with a casual lunch in a country restaurant. The afternoon will be spent playing some traditional games. Dinner at the hotel.

Sunday 28th September:

Trip to the Col Ignasse for a ride on the petit train to the top of La Rhune. A 2.5 hour walk will take us back down the mountain. Picnic lunch. Farewell dinner at the hotel.

Monday 29th September:

The bus will take all participants to Bayonne railway station in the morning to catch the 10.10 TGV for Paris, Montparnasse. This will be the only transport organised for that day. **Details will be confirmed a few months before the start of the tour.**

Tour conditions Included in your trip

All transport included in the tour itinerary, accommodation, breakfasts, lunches, dinners, and activities as stated in the brochure. Menus will be organised by us to offer you a taste of the many specialties of regional gastronomy. Wine is included with all sit-down meals but if the wines are not to your liking, you are free to purchase your own. The quantity of the wine served will be enough to accompany the meals.

Conditions for bookings and cancellations

Everyone participating in the tour must complete and sign a booking form and pay a **non-refundable** deposit of 500 Australian dollars per person. Your booking will be secured upon payment of the deposit. If you would like to join us on a tour you will need to forward the booking form and a recent photo to Pyrenees Tours, PO Box 469 Bowral NSW 2576 Australian Back transfer above the provide a secure of the deposit.

Australia. Bank transfer, cheques or credit card payments are available. Credit card surcharges apply: Visa, Mastercard 1.8%. Amex 2.8%. All participants must provide proof of travel insurance. We strongly recommend that you purchase travel insurance as soon as you have paid any monies towards any of your travel arrangements. Make sure your travel insurance covers you against loss of deposit or final payment, in case of unavoidable cancellations. A signed accident waiver and release of liability







form, which we will provide, will need to be included with your doctor's certificate stating you are fit and well to undertake a walking tour. The balance of the tour cost is due no less than 60 days before departure of the tour. Prices are based on the cost and exchange of the Euro at the time of printing. We reserve the right to adjust the tour price should there be significant changes in the rates.

Due to financial commitments to our various suppliers, your deposit will be forfeited if you cancel. Cancellations within 60 to 30 days before the start of the tour: 30% refund of monies paid. (not including deposit). Cancellations within 29 to 0 days before start of tour: No refund will be given.

Not included in your trip

Tips, insurance (i.e. travel, health, loss or damage to personal property), phone calls, extra expenses which are not included in the itinerary.

Tour cancellation

Should it be necessary to cancel the tour, due to failure to reach minimum numbers, 40 days' notice will be given and a full refund of the tour cost, if paid, will be refunded. Due to constant changes with Covid restrictions, please visit smarttraveller.gov.au if you live in Australia, or your relevant government web page from your country, to comply with the French requirements to enable you to enter France and other European countries.

Our responsibility as tour organisers

It is our responsibility to ensure that tour activities have been organised as stated in the program. It is also our right to alter the itinerary, if necessary, in the event of unforeseen circumstances. Any extra costs resulting from these alterations will not be our responsibility.

No responsibility will be accepted for any delays occurring during the tour. It is at our discretion to stop any persons from participating in any of the activities should they not have the required level of fitness on any particular day.

Responsibility of tour participants

It is the responsibility of the participant to organise and pay for all travel documents, i.e., passports, visas, tickets, insurance, departure tax. All participants need travel insurance. The participants will be responsible for any injury, sickness, loss, or damage that might occur.

If any participant wishes to alter the itinerary in any way, all resulting costs and organisation will be his/her responsibility. It is the responsibility of the participant to be at the point of pick-up as specified and at the time specified. If this is not possible it is the participant's responsibility to rejoin the tour at his/her own expense.

Awareness

Participants should be aware of the risks and dangers involved in walking activities such as weather extremes due to unexpected and sudden changes, rocky and uneven terrain on which the activities may take place, physical exertion and lack of immediate medical assistance due to remoteness of the activities. Participants will need adequate fitness to undertake the walking activities.
